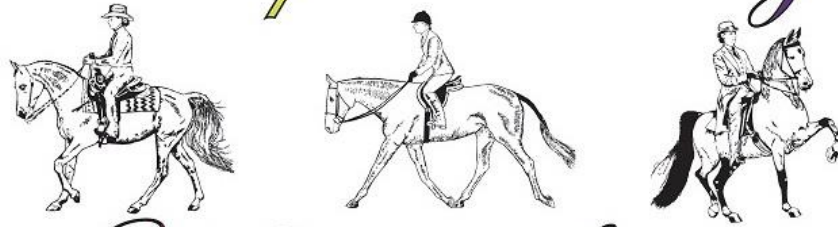

## 2020 SEPTEMBER VIRTUAL SHOW CLASS LIST

1. **Classes may be divided at show management's discretion if entries warrant.**
2. **To enter a "Championship" class, the exhibitor must have competed in the qualifying class.**
3. **If you showed with us already this year, you will use the same rider number. If you are a new exhibitor, the secretary will email you a rider number shortly after receipt of entry form.**
4. **Exhibitors must join the "CHAMPLAIN VALLEY HORSE SHOWS VIRTUAL HORSE SHOWS" Facebook page to submit their videos for judging.**
5. **There will be a post for each class to submit your entries under every couple days starting September 15<sup>th</sup>. Please include your exhibitor name, equine's name and rider number in your post.**
6. **Exhibitors must submit their entry forms at least 3 DAYS prior to the first classes you want to enter.**
7. **Please submit your videos between 8 a.m. on start day to 9 p.m. on end day for each session.**

## **\*\* SHOW RULES AND REGULATIONS \*\***

1. Exhibitors are responsible for knowing the requirements and specifications of the classes they enter. Exhibitors may be disqualified or penalized by the judge for using inappropriate or incorrect tack/attire for the class or not doing your pattern correctly. A complete list of class specifications and proper attire and equipment are at the end of this prize list.
2. **HELMET RULE - ASTM/SEI approved helmets with a secured chin strap are required for ALL RIDERS 18 & under who compete hunter style in any class.**
3. **SHOW FEES** – Regular classes are \$8 each; Championship classes are \$10 each. Eight placings awarded in every class. A \$10 office fee will be assessed per entry to help cover the cost of mailing fees, CC processing fees, and other expenses.
4. **PAYMENT/REFUND TERMS** – Entry forms with payment via credit/debit card or PayPal are required by midnight at least 3 DAYS BEFORE the start of the classes you want to enter. Credit/debit cards will be processed within 48 hours of receipt of entry form. **No refunds without a vet/doctor note.**
5. The judge's decision is final. Notes from the judge may be available by request.

## **\*\* VIDEO PERFORMANCE REQUIREMENTS \*\***

1. Exhibitors must wear appropriate riding attire and tack. You do not have to wear show clothes, but exhibitors must wear appropriate boots, pants/breeches, shirt and proper headgear for seat being exhibited. The secretary will provide you with a virtual entry number and you must create your own number to use for the video. If you have your own number you want to use, please check with the secretary to make sure that number is available. **Please make sure your number is clearly visible in the video AND listed in your post.**
2. Exhibitors will need up to two people to assist them. One to video their performance and one to be a pretend judge for showmanship or other patterned classes.
3. It does not matter what video device you use, but please keep the video as still as possible and do it at an appropriate distance to the exhibitor. **Zoom in if the exhibitor is farther away so the judge can better see the exhibitor.** Also please make sure there is enough lighting that the judge can easily see the whole horse and rider. If you are using an outdoor area/arena, don't video in the early morning or late afternoon where the sun could impair parts of the video. Nobody else is allowed to be in the ring while exhibitor is being videoed and the immediate area should be free of any distractions such as dogs or children. Please use an appropriately sized space when recording riding classes - do not use a small ring or round pen. An open space such as a flat pasture or lawn is also OK to use.
4. Videos must be one constant performance. Exhibitors may not cut or edit the video in any way or they will be disqualified.
5. Exhibitors may use the same video for multiple classes if they choose.
6. Patterns are provided on the website.
7. Exhibitors can enter as many classes as they qualify for. Exhibitors may enter a class more than once with a different horse; and horses may compete in the same class with different riders but you will need a different number for each rider.
8. **IT IS THE EXHIBITOR'S RESPONSIBILITY TO DOUBLECHECK YOUR VIDEOS AFTER YOU'VE UPLOADED THEM TO MAKE SURE THE WHOLE VIDEO POSTED AND THAT IT'S FOR THE CORRECT EQUINE/EXHIBITOR! IF YOUR VIDEO STOPS DURING YOUR PERFORMANCE, THE JUDGE CANNOT ADEQUATELY JUDGE YOU AND YOU WILL EITHER BE DISQUALIFIED OR PLACED LAST.**

9. Video requirements –

**FOR SHOWMANSHIP CLASSES:** You will need cones or markers as indicated in the pattern.

1. This class requires two people - a videographer and pretend judge. The pretend judge will stand where indicated in the pattern. The Videographer should stand where indicated in the pattern.
2. Exhibitor to perform pattern. Once exhibitor has completed the "set up for inspection" section in their pattern, the pretend judge will walk around the horse back to position. The exhibitor can then finish their pattern.

**FOR IN HAND CLASSES:** You will need cones or markers as indicated in the pattern.

1. Videographer should be where the judge stands at cone 4 approximately 5-10 feet from cone. **From cone 3 to 4, videographer should video horse coming straight toward you; and vice versa, straight away from cone 4-3.** Exhibitors should be mindful of their position to make sure as much of the horse is being shown in the video. Two exhibitors are allowed for saddleseat style horses.

#### FOR LEADLINE CLASS:

1. Follow pattern as indicated on the website. Exhibitors may have one additional person on the opposite side being videoed as a spotter if necessary. Helmets required.

#### FOR RIDING CLASSES:

1. For walk/trot classes, exhibitors will have two minutes to perform a walk and trot/jog both ways of the ring. For w/t/c classes, exhibitors will have three minutes to perform a walk, trot/jog, and canter/lope both ways of the ring. Upon completion of performance, exhibitor may come to the center of the ring as they would in a regular class and stand for a few seconds for final impressions.

#### FOR EQUITATION PATTERN CLASSES: You will need cones or markers as indicated in the pattern.

1. Videographer should be where indicated in the pattern. Exhibitor to perform pattern as indicated.

#### TROTTING GROUND POLES: You need 8 ground poles as indicated in the pattern.

1. Exhibitor to trot across each set of poles once, circle, and go back across poles.
2. Videographer to stand to the left side of the poles.

#### FOR CHAMPIONSHIP CLASSES:

1. See showmanship championship patterns on website. In Hand Championship pattern is the same as the regular class.
2. Since this is a separate class, exhibitors may submit a separate video for your championship class or reuse your regular class video. This class will be judged the same as the qualifier. A larger ribbon and 3 extra points are awarded in championship classes.

#### **\*\*\* AFTER JUDGING \*\*\***

Once all entries have been uploaded for each section, the class will be closed and the judge will start evaluating them shortly after. Results will be posted on our Facebook page for each section as soon as possible. Please note that because the judge must view every entry individually instead of in a group like a normal show, it may take some time to get results, especially if we have a lot of entries. We reserve the right to add additional judges so one judge isn't too overwhelmed. Exhibitors will be mailed their ribbons (if wanted, see entry form) and any prizes so please remember to **write your address on the entry form.**

#### **\*\* RIBBON CREDIT \*\***

If you don't want your ribbons mailed to you, you can get cash back for them instead. It also saves the show money as it costs between \$9-\$13 in postage to send a package to each exhibitor. Regular class ribbons are \$1.00 each; championship class ribbons are \$2.00 each; and high point championship ribbons are \$3.00. You can choose to receive the money as a cash payback mailed to you in the form of a check or have a credit toward entries for the next show. Indicate your preference on the online entry form.

#### **\*\* DEFINITION OF DIVISIONS \*\***

**All ages are as of January 1 of the current year.**

Youth Walk/Trot – 18 & under. Walk and trot/jog only. All seats. May be divided into 13 & under and 14-18.

Adult Walk/Trot – 19 & over. Walk and trot/jog only. All seats.

Youth Beginner Canter - 18 & under. Walk, trot/jog, and limited canter/lope. All seats.

***PLEASE NOTE: Walk/Trot divisions above are based on RIDER'S level of ability, not the horse's. If you are a w/t/c level exhibitor and are showing an equine that is only at a w/t level, you must enter the Green Horse/Pony division.***

Green Horse/Pony – any age horse in first or second year of showing under saddle. All seats. Walk and trot/jog only.

***Division is based on the horse's level of ability, not the rider's.***

Youth – 18 and under, walk, trot/jog, and canter/lope. May be divided into 13 & under and 14-18 if entries warrant.

Adult – 19 and over, walk, trot/jog, and canter/lope.

Pee Wee – 12 & under, walk and trot/jog only. Attendants allowed in the ring but cannot be connected to exhibitor.

Excessive help by attendant to be penalized. **Helmets required.** All exhibitors may use two hands.

Leadline – 10 and under. Walk and limited trot/jog only. **Helmets required.** All exhibitors may use two hands.

## **DIVISION HIGH POINT CHAMPIONSHIPS**

Must enter 6 classes to qualify. Per horse/rider combination.

Champion receives ribbon and \$25 gift card of their choice. Ribbons only to 2<sup>nd</sup>-4<sup>th</sup>.

**Pee Wee Division** – Showmanship ~ In Hand ~ Equitation ~ Equitation Pattern ~ Pleasure ~ Benefit Pleasure  
(must enter 5 classes)

**Leadline Division** – Showmanship ~ Equitation ~ Pleasure (must enter 2 classes)

## **PROPER TACK AND ATTIRE & CLASS SPECIFICATIONS**

**Attire** – Exhibitors do not need to wear show clothes but must wear appropriate riding attire. **No tank tops, shorts, sneakers, baseball hats, etc. No attire with farm/stable logos on them.**

**In-Hand Tack** – Western entries shall be shown in a suitable leather or nylon halter in good condition and fit to the horse with a suitable lead. English/saddle type entries shall be shown in a traditional English style bridle or halter. Whips/bats allowed for english entries only. Saddleseat entries may use two exhibitors.

**Western Seat Tack** – In all western classes, a traditional western saddle made of leather or suitable synthetic fabric allowed. Stirrups shall not be tied to one another or to the saddle. Bridle may be of standard plain or silver headstall, split ear, browband, shaped ear, etc. Nosebands, martingales, and tie-downs prohibited. Western style curb or leveraged bits (broken or solid) with a port no higher than 3 ½” and a curb strap at least ½” wide of leather, nylon, or flat chain are required in all classes. Riders to use only one hand when using a leveraged bit. Only junior horses 5 years and under may use a traditional O-ring, D-ring, or eggbut snaffle with a ring between 2” and 4”, bosal, or hackamore and may use two hands. Slip and gag bits and snaffles with fixed rein attachments providing leverage are prohibited. **EXCEPTION: Green Horse/Pony entries may use a snaffle bit with two hands on any age horse in the Green Horse/Pony classes ONLY.**

**Hunter Seat Tack** – In all English/hunter classes, a traditional English style forward seat, close contact, or dressage saddle is acceptable. Flat saddle seat type saddles are prohibited. Bridles must have a bit – no hunter hackamores, etc. allowed. A traditional snaffle bridle with an O-ring, D-ring, kimberwicke, or eggbut bit is acceptable. Pelham or full bridles are allowed. Martingales and tie-downs are prohibited. Flash or drop nosebands, **Micklem-style bridles**, standing and running martingales are prohibited. Bits of unconventional type are to be penalized at the judge’s discretion.

**Saddle Seat Tack** – A traditional flat cutback saddle seat/Lane Fox type saddle is required. Entries shall be shown in a full bridle with shank bit and bradoon, or a pelham bit.

### **CLASS SPECIFICATIONS**

#### **ALL SHOWMANSHIP CLASSES**

To be judged on showmanship with equine shown in hand, standing and at a walk and trot on the line; also on fitting, evidenced by grooming, condition, neatness and sportsmanship. Pattern required. Judged 60% on exhibitor's showmanship (leading, posing, poise, alertness, attitude, and appearance) and 40% on horse (condition, grooming, and tack). Conformation not to count. Patterns are posted on the website.

#### **ALL IN HAND/HALTER CLASSES**

Entries will enter the ring and perform the patterned required. To be judged on conformation, quality, substance, soundness and manners. Rating conformation depends upon objective evaluation of balance, structural correctness, breed and sex characteristics, and suitability to style being exhibited. Patterns are posted on the website.

#### **ALL EQUITATION CLASSES**

Riders will be judged on seat, hands, performance of horse, and suitability of horse to rider both ways of the ring.

**Walk/Trot Divisions** - To be shown at a walk and trot/jog only.

**Youth & Adult Divisions** - To be shown at a walk, trot/jog, and canter/lope. Chaps optional for western riders.

### ALL EQUITATION PATTERN CLASSES

Exhibitors to perform a simple pattern from the gate individually. Judged on exhibitor's overall poise, confidence, appearance and position, and control of mount throughout the pattern. Patterns are posted on the website.

### ALL PLEASURE CLASSES

To be judged on manners, performance, and suitability of mount to rider both ways of the ring.

Walk/Trot Divisions – To be shown at a walk and trot/jog only.

Open Divisions – To be shown at a walk, trot/jog, and canter/lope.

### MISCELLANEOUS CLASSES:

Shankless Showmanship – This is a showmanship class but done without holding a lead rope or reins. See pattern on website.

In Hand Trail - Open to any age horse or pony and any age exhibitor. Entrant to be judged on their performance over a course of 6-8 obstacles with emphasis on manners, response to the handler and attitude.

Trotting Ground Poles - English or Western. To be shown over a course of ground poles spaced at least 3' apart for ponies and 4' for horses. Judged on rider's equitation and ability to maneuver equine over poles in a straight, centered, and even-paced manner. Poles should be taken in the 2-point position. Exhibitors will be penalized for hitting the poles and/or knocking them out of place. A courtesy circle before first set of poles is allowed. Pattern posted on the website.

\$50 Disciplined Rail Challenge – This class is to show the ability of a highly trained equine. Final judging shall be on the best overall performance including responsiveness, manners, and quality of movements. Pattern available on website.

Bitless Pleasure – Open to any age equine. Equine's to be shown in one of the following: bitless bridle, bosal, hackamore, or fitted halter with reins. Open and Walk/Trot classes.

Pretty In Pink Pleasure – Open to any exhibitor/equine. Exhibitors to use as much pink tack, attire, and accessories as they want, there are no limitations. To be judged 75% on pleasure and 25% on tack and attire.
