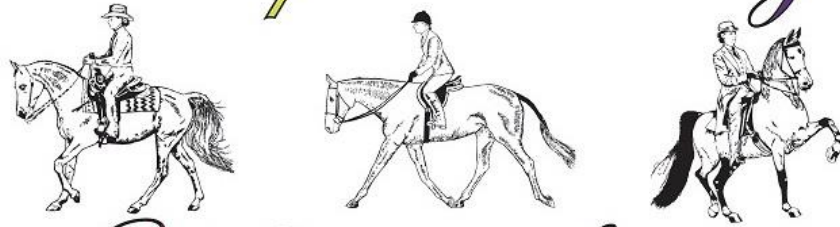

CLASS LIST

1. Eight placings awarded in each class. Classes may be combined or divided via age or seat at show management's discretion pending # of entries.
2. To enter a "\$25 Championship" class, the exhibitor must have competed in the qualifying class. Class winners receive a \$25 cash payback, longer ribbons and extra points toward your show/series championships.
3. Upon receipt of an entry form, the secretary will email you a rider number which you will use for that horse/rider combo.
4. Exhibitors must join the "CHAMPLAIN VALLEY HORSE SHOWS VIRTUAL HORSE SHOWS" Facebook page to submit their videos for judging.
5. There will be a post for each class to submit your entries under every couple days as indicated on the class list. Please include exhibitor name, equine name, and rider number in your post.
6. Please submit your entry forms at least 3 DAYS prior to the first classes you want to enter.
7. Please submit your videos between 8 a.m. on start day to 9 p.m. on end day for each session. There will be a one-day break in-between sections for catch up time.

Per horse/rider combination. Total points accumulated in classes below. Must enter a minimum of 6 classes to qualify except where noted. Champion receives ribbon and prize; ribbons only reserve-4th.

** SHOW RULES AND REGULATIONS **

- Exhibitors are responsible for knowing the requirements and specifications of the classes they enter. Exhibitors may be disqualified or penalized by the judge for using inappropriate or incorrect tack/attire for the class or not doing your pattern correctly.** A complete list of class specifications and proper attire and equipment are at the end of this prize list.
- HELMET RULE - ASTM/SEI approved helmets with a secured chin strap are required for ALL RIDERS 18 & under who compete hunter style in any class.**
- SHOW FEES** – Regular classes are \$8 each; Championship classes are \$10 each. A \$10 office fee will be assessed per entry to help cover the cost of mailing fees, CC processing fees, and other expenses. A division package, which includes all your division qualifying classes listed above plus office/shipping fees, will be offered for a flat fee of \$70. Additional classes are at the regular rate. Eight placings awarded in every class.
- PAYMENT/REFUND TERMS** – Entry forms and payment is required by midnight at least 3 DAYS BEFORE the start of the classes you want to enter. Exhibitors can pay with a debit/credit card listed on their entry form or via PayPal/Venmo. See instruction on our website. **No refunds without a vet/doctor note.**
- The judge's decision is final. Although judges may write little notes down when judging each performance, if you want a more detailed critique of your performance, we are happy to ask the judge to do so for an additional fee per class at the judge's discretion.
- SERIES CHAMPIONSHIPS** – If you'd like to sign up for the 3-show series championship, there is a \$10 fee which can be added to your online entry form in September or October. Exhibitors must compete at two shows to qualify. Classes to count are the division qualifying classes listed above. Champions receive a \$50 Visa gift card and ribbon; ribbons only for 2nd-4th but we will try to give each of our exhibitors a prize ☐

** VIDEO PERFORMANCE REQUIREMENTS **

- Exhibitors must wear appropriate riding attire and tack. You do not have to wear show clothes, but exhibitors must wear appropriate boots, pants/breeches, shirt and proper headgear for seat being exhibited. The secretary will provide you with a virtual entry number and you must create your own number to use for the video. If you have your own number you want to use, please check with the secretary to make sure that number is available. **Please make sure your number is listed in your post.**
- Exhibitors will need up to two people to assist them depending on the class. One to video their performance and one to be a pretend judge for showmanship and/or equitation pattern classes.
- It does not matter what video device you use, but please keep the video as still as possible and do it at an appropriate distance to the exhibitor. **Please zoom in if the exhibitor is farther away so the judge can better see the exhibitor!** Also please make sure there is enough lighting that the judge can easily see the whole horse and rider. If you are using an outdoor arena, don't video in the early morning or late afternoon where the sun could impair parts of the video. Nobody else should be in the ring while exhibitor is being videoed and the immediate area should be free of any distractions such as dogs or children. Please use an appropriately sized space when recording riding classes - do not use a small ring or round pen. An open space such as a flat pasture or lawn is also OK to use.
- Videos must be one constant performance. Exhibitors may not cut or edit the video in any way or they will be disqualified. Exhibitors may use the same video for multiple classes if they choose.

5. Patterns are provided on the website.
6. Exhibitors can enter as many classes as they qualify for. Exhibitors may enter a class more than once with a different horse; and horses may compete in the same class with different riders but you will need a different number for each rider. Youth and Adult exhibitors may cross enter English & Western divisions.
7. **IT IS THE EXHIBITOR'S RESPONSIBILITY TO DOUBLECHECK YOUR VIDEOS AFTER YOU'VE UPLOADED THEM TO MAKE SURE THE WHOLE VIDEO POSTED AND THAT IT'S FOR THE CORRECT EQUINE/EXHIBITOR! IF YOUR VIDEO STOPS DURING YOUR PERFORMANCE, THE JUDGE CANNOT ADEQUATELY JUDGE YOU AND YOU WILL EITHER BE DISQUALIFIED OR PLACED LAST.**

FOR SHOWMANSHIP CLASSES: You will need cones or markers as indicated in the pattern.

1. This class requires two people - a videographer and pretend judge. The pretend judge will stand where indicated in the pattern. The Videographer should stand just slightly behind and to the right of judge.
2. Exhibitor to perform pattern. Once exhibitor has completed the "set up for inspection" section in their pattern, the pretend judge will walk around the horse back to position. The exhibitor can then finish their pattern.

FOR LEADLINE CLASS:

1. Follow pattern as indicated on the website. Exhibitors may have one additional person on the opposite side being videoed as a spotter if necessary. Helmets required.

FOR RIDING CLASSES:

1. For walk/trot classes, exhibitors will have 2 ½ minutes to perform a walk and trot/jog both ways of the ring. For w/t/c classes, exhibitors will have 3 ½ minutes to perform a walk, trot/jog, and canter/lope both ways of the ring. Upon completion of performance, exhibitor may come to the center of the ring as they would in a regular class and stand for a few seconds for final impressions.

FOR EQUITATION PATTERN CLASSES: You will need cones or markers as indicated in the pattern.

1. Videographer should stand just behind and to the right of where judge is indicated in the pattern. Exhibitor to perform pattern as indicated.

FOR CHAMPIONSHIP CLASSES:

1. Classes will be judged the same as the qualifier. Exhibitors may use their qualifying video for the championship class.

***** AFTER JUDGING *****

Once all entries have been uploaded for each section, the class will be closed and the judge will start evaluating them shortly after. Results will be posted on our Facebook page for each section as soon as we get the results from the judge. Please note that because the judge must view every entry individually instead of in a group like a normal show, it may take a few days to get results, especially if we have a lot of entries, or if the judge has schedule issues. We reserve the right to add additional judges so one judge isn't too overwhelmed. Exhibitors will be mailed their ribbons and any prizes so please remember to **write your FULL address on the entry form.**

**** DEFINITION OF DIVISIONS ****

All ages are as of January 1 of the current year. Exhibitors may not cross-enter divisions.

Beginner – 18 & under. Walk and trot/jog only. All seats.

Advanced Beginner – 18 & under. Walk, trot/jog, and limited canter/lope. All seats.

Adult Walk/Trot – 19 & over. Walk and trot/jog only. All seats.

PLEASE NOTE: Walk/Trot divisions above are based on RIDER'S level of ability, not the horse's. If you are a w/t/c level exhibitor and are showing an equine that is only at a w/t level, you must enter the Green Horse/Pony division.

Green Horse/Pony – any age horse in first or second year of showing under saddle. All seats. Walk and trot/jog only.

Exhibitors may use a snaffle bit on any age horse. ***Division is based on the horse's level of ability, not the rider's.***

Youth – 18 & under, walk, trot/jog, and canter/lope. May cross enter English & Western divisions.

Adult – 19 & over, walk, trot/jog, and canter/lope. May cross enter English & Western divisions.

Pee Wee – 12 & under, walk and trot/jog only. Exhibitors may use two hands. Attendants allowed in the ring but cannot be connected to exhibitor. Excessive help by attendant to be penalized. **Helmets required.**

Leadline – 10 & under. Walk and limited trot/jog only. **Helmets required.** Exhibitors may use two hands. One additional attendant is allowed but please walk on opposite side that is being filmed.

PROPER TACK AND ATTIRE

Attire – Exhibitors do not need to wear show clothes but must wear appropriate riding attire. **No tank tops, shorts, sneakers, baseball hats, etc. No attire with farm/stable logos on them.**

Western Seat Tack – In all western classes, a traditional western saddle made of leather or suitable synthetic fabric allowed. Stirrups shall not be tied to one another or to the saddle. Bridle may be of standard plain or silver headstall, split ear, browband, shaped ear, etc. Nosebands, martingales, and tie-downs prohibited. Western style curb or leveraged bits (broken or solid) with a port no higher than 3 ½” and a curb strap at least ½” wide of leather, nylon, or flat chain are required in all classes. Riders to use only one hand when using a leveraged bit. Only junior horses 5 years and under may use a traditional O-ring, D-ring, or eggbutt snaffle with a ring between 2” and 4”, bosal, or hackamore and may use two hands. Slip and gag bits and snaffles with fixed rein attachments providing leverage are prohibited. **EXCEPTION: Green Horse/Pony entries may use a snaffle bit with two hands on any age horse in the Green Horse/Pony classes ONLY.**

Hunter Seat Tack – In all English/hunter classes, a traditional English style forward seat, close contact, or dressage saddle is acceptable. Flat saddle seat type saddles are prohibited. Bridles must have a bit – no hunter hackamores, etc. allowed. A traditional snaffle bridle with an O-ring, D-ring, kimberwicke, or eggbutt bit is acceptable. Pelham or full bridles are allowed. Martingales and tie-downs are prohibited. Flash or drop nosebands, **Micklem-style bridles**, standing and running martingales are prohibited. Bits of unconventional type are to be penalized at the judge’s discretion.

Saddle Seat Tack – A traditional flat cutback saddle seat/Lane Fox type saddle is required. Entries shall be shown in a full bridle with shank bit and bradoon, or a pelham bit.

CLASS SPECIFICATIONS

ALL SHOWMANSHIP CLASSES

To be judged on showmanship with equine shown in hand, standing and at a walk and trot on the line; also on fitting, evidenced by grooming, condition, neatness and sportsmanship. Pattern required. Judged 60% on exhibitor's showmanship (leading, posing, poise, alertness, attitude, and appearance) and 40% on horse (condition, grooming, and tack). Conformation not to count. Patterns are posted on the website.

ALL EQUITATION CLASSES

Riders will be judged on seat, hands, performance of horse, and suitability of horse to rider both ways of the ring.

Walk/Trot Divisions - To be shown at a walk and trot/jog only.

Youth & Adult Divisions - To be shown at a walk, trot/jog, and canter/lope. Chaps optional for western riders.

ALL EQUITATION PATTERN CLASSES

Exhibitors to perform a simple pattern from the gate individually. Judged on exhibitor's overall poise, confidence, appearance and position, and control of mount throughout the pattern. Patterns are posted on the website.

ALL PLEASURE CLASSES

To be judged on manners, performance, and suitability of mount to rider both ways of the ring.

Walk/Trot Divisions – To be shown at a walk and trot/jog only.

Open Divisions – To be shown at a walk, trot/jog, and canter/lope.
